Outside of his job, Evan enjoyed being outdoors, going to Lambeau Field to watch his beloved Green Bay Packers, spending time with his wife Christie and their dog Savannah and riding his Harley-Davidson motorcycle.

The education, experiences and friendships from his years spent at Catholic Central were very important in developing the character, values and work ethic that defined who Evan was throughout his life.
