Lorraine M. and Robert C. Beix Memorial Scholarship

Bob and Lorraine Beix believed in the importance of a Catholic education and have provided that this scholarship is set up to assist incoming freshmen who wish to enroll at Catholic Central High School, but lack the financial resources to do so.

Bob Beix was educated at St. Charles School. He was a longtime basketball coach at St. Mary's High School (Catholic Central) in the late '30's and early '40's. He was also the coach of St. Mary's boxing team when boxing was a part of the Hilltopper athletic program. Bob was a charter member of the Athletic Association and he was the color man announcing the football team in the '50's and '60's.

Lorraine's education started at St. Joseph's in Lyons and finished at St. Mary's High School where she was salutatorian of her class of 1993. Her strong foundational skills were more than adequate when she continued her education at Spencerian Business College. Her Catholic values and business experience allowed her to carry on as a young widow with three children. Lorraine was a member of the Catholic Central supportive Roundtable organization.

The Beix's were very involved at St. Mary's/Catholic Central and through their Christian values they believed that helping other people was very important.

This scholarship is to be awarded to an incoming freshman based on financial need. Other criteria include scholastic ability, leadership and personal character. The scholarship award will be credited to the recipient's tuition account after he/she completes the first semester of freshman year.
